Statement

"I don't know how to love a place..."

Andrea Coltman has always felt displaced due to her family escaping from Hungary in 1956. Belonging nowhere, she is a nomadic observer drawn to capturing snapshots of transitional locations through painting initially inspired by The Dutch Masters as a young child.

Absorbed with the notion of places and spaces of transition, Andrea's works questions places of constant transformation drawing on her own movements. There are connections and disconnections revealing a state of flux, the crossing of physical and metaphorical boundaries, discovering places of change whilst the artist moves between material, physical and emotional states.

Combining figuration and abstraction, Andrea responds to the passer-by and the environment. Adding hi-vis linear systems, editing, re-editing, duplicating, interpreting, and re-interpreting the literal context is part of her process. The use of repetition in the work is thematic, alluding to the cyclical nature of her daily life. Precision is implied, imperfections arise, and unexpected narratives unravel with dystopian overtones.

Andrea reflects psychologically on the everyday, overlooked instant or object. She is drawn to the ephemeral, the split second, a passage through a place or environment. The artist is a rootless wanderer, and wonderer', a 21st Century Flâneuse.

Andrea is a London and Kent based artist who graduated with an MFA from UAL, London in 2017.

Biography

Andrea has always been creative having initially trained as a Graphic and Exhibition Designer. She began her profession working in a Print shop, followed by a Publishing House and finally at British Gas before having a career break to bring up her family.

Andrea became a freelance Graphic Designer, whilst bringing up her family as a single parent, taking various courses to learn Computer skills related to Adobe Creative Suite. Having received a very positive response to her work during South East Open Studio in 2010 Andrea chose to pursue her ambition to become a qualified professional artist.

In 2012 Andrea passed her Art Foundation Degree at West Kent College, partnered with **The University of Greenwich**, attaining a Distinction before completing her BA(Hons) Art in 2013 with a Distinction at the same college, which then partnered with **The University of Kent**.

In 2017 Andrea completed a two-year extended MFA with The University of Arts, London.

For three consecutive years, 2016-2018, Andrea single-handedly created, led and participated in the first ever annual artist residency within a construction site on Canary Wharf.

The residency enjoyed a very well-respected alumni of over 30 artists. There were also some invited guest artists who lead workshops and seminars. The list includes: *Rebecca Byrne, Liz Elton, Rosalind Davies, Samuel L. Herbert, Ian Monroe and Andrea V. Wright*.

Andrea has also organised and curated several exhibitions, including fund raising projects, and has recently worked collaboratively with fellow Korean Artist, Joonhong Min, on a group exhibition held in 2023 *Reading Between The Lines*.

Andrea has both shown and sold work both nationally and internationally.

She currently shares a studio at The Koppel Project Bank, London.
